From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus:

As I mentioned at last Sunday's Masses, you deserve to hear the truth about the allegations raised in a letter many of you received from Mr. Patrick Marker. Pat Marker was abused by a member of my community while he was a student. The Abbey acknowledged the abuse inflicted by a member of the community, settled Mr. Marker's claim and has tried to engage him in helping other victims. Mr. Marker has chosen a different path. He has dedicated himself to raising doubts and undermining the integrity of Abbey members, including those who are innocent of these horrendous actions.

Mr. Marker often uses innuendo and unsubstantiated claims in his attacks on innocent Abbey members, as he did in the letter he sent to parishioners. For example, he links my name with Jacob Wetterling and Josh Guimond. The facts are clear. I was in France at the time of the Jacob Wetterling kidnapping. While I was on campus when Josh Guimond disappeared, I did not personally know him. The families of these two victims have suffered enough without Mr. Marker recklessly raising issues that have no basis in fact. Mr. Marker's letter does not deserve a point-by-point rebuttal. Suffice it to say that his allegations against me are an unwarranted and unjust attack on my reputation.

Saint John's Abbey deeply regrets the pain and harm suffered by Mr. Marker and other victims of abuse. The Abbey has worked with victims who have come forward to help them in their healing. The policy of Saint John's Abbey is to evaluate all credible claims about members of our community. We have enforced this policy consistently and rigorously. Our policy of evaluation and investigation has led us to painful truths about some members of our community. We have taken appropriate actions to sanction those who have abused and to assure that they will not be able to do so again.

I ask for your prayers and support as we go forward. Saint John's Abbey and the Diocese of Saint Cloud have responded to the legitimate and authentic claims of sexual abuse and will continue to put the victims of abuse ahead of any other interest.

Ministry Spotlight:

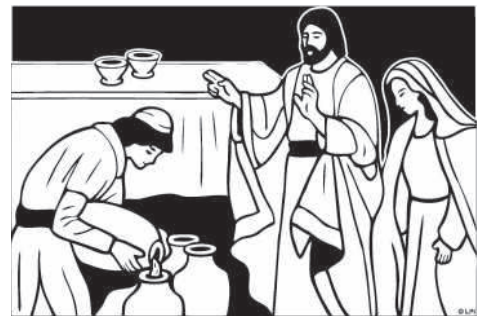
USHER

Ushers provide hospitality at weekend liturgies and other liturgical celebrations. Ushers assist with seating; take up the offering; distribute bulletins; attend to special needs such as sickness, restrooms, and reserved seating; and ensure that the building is left in a tidied condition. In addition, during the *Making Room at Our Table* construction project, ushers assist weekend and holyday Mass-goers who request assistance with transportation to and from the church and east parking lot. Ushers should arrive 30 minutes prior to liturgies.

To be successful at ushering, the ideal usher is hospitable; has knowledge of the building and procedures; and has a mature, yet gentle and caring, personality that can be effective in leading people in adult situations.

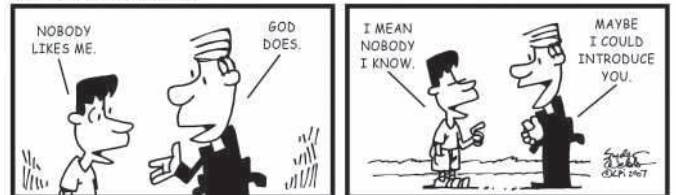
Registration for the 2013–14 school year will soon begin. Parishioners are given priority, but our Montessori preschool fills quickly.

Reflection

“There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, “They have no wine. *Why did you bring all of your friends along with you? No wonder the wine ran short.*

Please do something about this!” I just made up the last three lines of this quote from the Gospel for today, but I can imagine Mary may have said something like this to Jesus. We all know the rest of the story. Jesus took this opportunity to work a generous and compassionate sign for those at the wedding feast by providing more wine for the guests. Most likely some guests at the wedding feast had no clue what had taken place when Mary noticed the wine had run short and she went to Jesus for help. As word spread about the water becoming wine at the word of Jesus, “his disciples began to believe in him.” I would imagine lots of rumors began floating around among the people about what actually took place at the wedding feast. Maybe Jesus was invited to more weddings after that in the hope that he would provide wine or other things for their needs. One’s imagination, no doubt, can lend itself to some elaboration on this story and its meaning. The Gospel writer John provides us with some insight into this Cana event when he says: “Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory.” Whatever may have been Jesus intent when he changed water into wine, in faith we believe that Jesus cared enough about those people and He cares about us and he is not afraid to show it. For this love we are grateful.
